Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Standing at the beginning of a new year is a time filled with anticipation and possibilities. It's also a time when we're conscious that the year ahead is filled with the unknown. So, I think it's important, after the celebrations of Christmas end, and the shepherds and Magi have departed, and the decorations have been returned to the attic, that we reaffirm the name of Jesus most celebrated at Christmas: *Emmanuel*, "God with us."

As we move into the unknowns of January and the year ahead, we never do so alone. God goes with us. I don't know what 2020 holds any more than you do, but I know the One who does. And I know that God is still speaking today as much as in the time when Caesar August ruled the Roman Empire. We can be certain that God will provide direction one step at a time if we are actively seeking God's direction and actively listening for God's response.

Sometimes we forget that, after the Magi's visit, God told Joseph to flee with Mary and Jesus into Egypt because Herod was determined to find and destroy the child. But even in the darkest of circumstances, even in the unexpected detour to Egypt, God leads Joseph step by step. When God tells Joseph to flee in the middle of the night, God doesn't tell Joseph at that point how long

he should plan to stay in Egypt. And when God finally tells Joseph that the coast is clear to return to Israel, God doesn't initially tell Joseph WHERE in Israel. It's only AFTER Joseph arrives back in his own country that God tells him about the danger of Herod's son and directs Joseph to go to Nazareth instead of Bethlehem. (See Matthew 2:13-23)

Do you see how God gives Joseph just enough light to take the next step? Why might that be? Well, it certainly keeps Joseph close to God, listening carefully for the next instruction. And we know from scripture that God longs to grow a closer, more intimate relationship with each of us. Remember, Jesus's coming at Christmas was all about restoring our broken relationship with God.

Again, a new year brings anticipation and possibilities. What a wonderful opportunity for us individually, and corporately as a congregation, to recommit ourselves to listening for God's voice, to deepening our relationship with the One who tenderly loves and holds us in every new circumstance. It can be something as simple as setting aside five minutes a day, without screens or other distractions, to read a Psalm and then ask God to speak through it because you are listening.

I look forward to sharing with you the adventure of a new year, and to seeing all that God will do in and through you in the coming months. Happy New Year!!


