Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The season of Lent has begun, starting with our Ash Wednesday call to turn our hearts again towards God. A season of reflection and prayer may sound solemn when compared to the joyous celebration of Easter, and yet this season holds a unique joy all its own. Please take a moment to read the poem *Lent* by Ann Weems (see below). Savor the language. What words most jump out at you? Why do you think that is? Take a few minutes to reflect on this.

I love the image of touching Jesus' robe. It reminds me that for God, relationship is everything. Throughout scripture, we repeatedly see God pursuing relationship with his people, longing for us to willingly turn to him. Life is filled with distractions, some of them very good and even gifts from God! But when we become too enamored of the gifts, we can miss the wonder and healing of the Giver. Perhaps more than anything, Lent is a call to reorient ourselves toward the Lover of our souls.

As a church family, we'll be exploring the topic of "calling" during Lent. Every person is uniquely gifted and called by God to follow God, just as we are, watching and listening even in the simplest of our daily routines. Calling also describes the lifelong journey of connecting our own stories with God's story. Calling can shift and change over the course of a lifetime and across the seasons of our lives. In its broadest terms, calling is God's compass for us, individually and corporately, in terms of living into God's larger purposes in our generation.

To hear and know God's calling presupposes that God is still

speaking and that we are actively listening. One of the best ways I've found to pursue this kind of conversation with God is to write down my prayers – whether praises or confessions or requests – and then to pay attention and record God's various responses. If you'd like to learn more about this, I invite you to join me for the Faith Journaling class beginning next week. Details are on the next page!

During worship, we'll be focusing on how God called various people whose stories are told in the Bible. Some of the names you will recognize, but others might surprise you! I hope you'll join us for this special journey toward Jerusalem and Easter.

Outreach News

Your thoughtful and generous donations to the February mission initiatives are most appreciated! As a result of this drive, the Georgetown Council on Aging Marketplace received many boxes and bags of paper products for their ongoing ministry to elderly residents, the disabled, and folks who need assistance due to unforeseen circumstances. In conjunction with the paper collection, we have also helped in an outreach program to aid inmates in the Massachusetts prison system with two very basic necessities: soap and toothpaste. Those items were taken to the Haverhill Council on Aging where they were distributed through a prison visitation program sponsored by the faith community.

During Lent you are asked to respond to our **Church Finance Team's Lenten letter** that asks for support in maintaining our Church Home. It is also home for other non-profit organizations, and considered one of our Church's missions. **A percentage of the proceeds** derived from our Lenten Offering is designated for outreach, and this year that outreach **will benefit the** *One Great Hour of Sharing*, an offering that takes place in many church denominations across the United States on March 22. Since March 22 falls within the Lenten Season, it seems fitting to bring attention to the *One Great Hour of Sharing* through our sacrificial Lenten Offering that benefits both our church and outreach program.

The focus of *One Great Hour of Sharing*, sponsored by multiple denominations, is the plight of the seventy million world-wide refugees. Many of these people have fled their homes several times to avoid the ravages of civil war and natural disasters. Food, emergency shelters, and medical needs are distributed to thousands of homeless people impacted by natural disasters. Guns and violence rule the streets in countries where corrupt governments prevail, leading people to believe their only hope is escape. They are the thousands who are displaced. One of the ways we can make an impact in such catastrophic situations is to combine our efforts and monetary contributions with other churches in unity of purpose: to bring compassion and assistance to those who are in desperate need.

Please respond generously to the Lenten Offering Letter this year.
