

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

When Thomas Jefferson commissioned Lewis and Clark to find a water route that would connect the Mississippi River to the Pacific Ocean, everyone just *knew* that such a route existed. Meriwether Lewis was a river expert planning to explore America's newly purchased territory by boat. But as the Corps of Discovery made their way upstream to the mouth of the Missouri river, they instead encountered something they had not expected: The Rocky Mountains. Their canoes would be of no use to them there and would need to be left behind. They suddenly found themselves in uncharted territory that looked different from anything they'd ever known. All their river expertise and past experience would be of no use to them if they moved off the map and into the uncertainty of what the mountains might hold for them.

At that point, Lewis and Clark could simply have taken their team back to Washington and informed Jefferson that no water route existed. But Meriwether Lewis was a man of Enlightenment values with their conviction that growth of human knowledge leads to growth of human happiness. So for him, every step he took to learn something new would be a step that changed the world. Lewis' core value led him to proceed with the journey without a map, and that of course resulted in enormous contributions to science.

Every person and organization possesses a core value. And as First Congregational Church stands in the midst of this season of transition facing some uncharted territory, we have an opportunity to pause and ask: What is our deepest value as a church? What is our 'why'? What is our core DNA that motivates us and should never change? And then how do we adapt this thing that will never change so that it becomes valuable to others, especially in serving our community at its points of greatest pain and need. I'm grateful to those of you who joined our recent Zoom gatherings to explore some of these questions. You brought so many wonderful stories of the past and wishes for the future! Our next step will be to unpack your feedback and look for themes to help us clarify our vision as a congregation. Please know that you are all invited to a half-day visioning retreat for that purpose. It will take place via Zoom on Saturday, September 26, from 9:00 am to noon. Zoom ID 733 801 5830. In addition, I will be leading a Sunday morning study of the book *Canoeing the Mountains* by Tod Bolsinger. It uses the Lewis and Clark expedition as a guide for journeying during uncertain times. The study will take place on Sunday mornings at 10:00 beginning on September 27. Stay tuned for details!

Finally, rest assured that, although we may be uncertain about what the future holds, God is not, and God will continue to walk with us as we seek God's vision for the journey forward.

## **Regathering**

The Church Council of the First Congregational Church of Georgetown initiated reopening planning for the fall 2020 earlier this summer and has been guided by the following key principle for returning to the church in the fall 2020:

• Worship together while protecting the health and safety of the congregation, staff, and people in the surrounding communities.

It is our goal to gather together either on the church grounds (weather permitting) or within the sanctuary, beginning on September 13, 2020. The following prerequisite must be met before we will gather together.

• The number of Covid-19 cases in the town of Georgetown must experience a downward trend in the number of cases over a two week period prior to the re-opening of the Church. If any spikes in cases occur, the Church will not re-open.

In anticipation that the above prerequisite will be met, the re-opening plan outlines the steps that have been put into place to safely worship together will be available on our website (**www.fccgeorgetownma.org**) by September 13.

<u>Please note</u> that the church council strongly encourages anyone that is not feeling well, or does not feel safe worshipping together to remain at home.

Worship services will continue to be offered via ZOOM and we hope that everyone will continue to join us either in person or remotely.
