


FIRST CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH

About Us

One of the older churches in Essex County, we were officially organized on October 4, 1732 in a building known simply as the Old South Meeting House. The first two ministers served a total of 113 years. In 1857 the Reverend Charles Beecher, a member of the famous Beecher family, began a turbulent twenty-five year ministry, during which time the church split; 85 members withdrew to form the Memorial Church in 1866.

Our present building was erected and dedicated in 1874; we became the First Congregational Church in 1908, when members of the Memorial Church reunited with members of their parent church. The church's Paul Revere and Sons' bell, rung by rope, has tolled for Sunday worshippers since 1815; it now calls the congregation together at 10:00 a.m. during the summer months, and at 11:00 a.m. during the fall, winter, and spring.


The 1,040 pipe tracker organ is noted in the area for its outstanding tone and quality. We are fortunate to have three volunteer choirs - Senior Choir, Youth Choir for girls of high school age, and a Junior Choir for children. In addition, there is opportunity for talented instrumental musicians to play in various ensembles for morning worship. Other activities for youth of our church include two sessions of church school, one at 11:00 for nursery through second grade; older classes, third through high school, meet at 9:30. The Junior and Senior High Youth Fellowships meet at various times for diversified activities of social, educational and religious value.


Other groups within the church are; the Couples Club, for people of all ages singles are most welcome - who gather each month for supper and program on various subjects; the Women's Guild, which sponsors interesting programs for women of all ages; the Women's Missionary Society, a group dedicated to study and missionary work.

Today's church is a seven-day-a-week institution, which has become a center for community activities, in addition to our own church programs. It is a regular meeting house for Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts; it serves as the Regional Center for the Welcome Wagon Newcomers' Club, and Essex Agricultural Extension Classes. The First Congregational Church of Georgetown is a friendly church where a warm welcome awaits you.


