Thank you all for your *super* generous support of the March 11th **One Great Hour of Sharing.** The final tally of this special offering amounted to **\$725!** We are blown away!

**BLANKET THE WORLD WITH LOVE** is the theme for our mission in April. For the last fifty years our congregation has sponsored the purchase of blankets for **Church World Service**, a very old and trusted institution that includes 37 Christian denominations, and helps people stay warm in the face of extreme hardships. Recipients sleep in Boston shelters; they are poor goat herders in the cold mountains of Bolivia and use blankets for their personal "tents"; they are survivors of the war in Syria and have carried their only possessions in their CWS blanket; they are the street people of Uruguay. YELLOW stands for sun and spring! We'll be purchasing yellow CWS blankets, a lighter-weight blanket especially manufactured for spring and summer CWS recipients. Ten dollars will provide one person with warmth, comfort and love when they receive their yellow blanket. You may wish to purchase one blanket - or, a portion of a blanket, or multiple blankets on Sunday, April 15th or Sunday, April 22nd in time for spring distribution. If you consider writing a check, please make it payable to the First Congregational Church of Georgetown.
