On Sunday, December 8th following worship Fellowship Hall is turning into Santa's tiny village.




CONTEST

Outreach

Many thanks to all who participated in the Thanksgiving Project for OUR NEIGHBOR'S TABLE. We have delivered twenty-four bags, filled with Thanksgiving dinner "trimmings" and grocery store gift certificates that were distributed to struggling families in twelve area towns (including Georgetown) by Our Neighbors' Table located in Amesbury. This is a finely-tuned, well-organized Food Pantry where clients are treated respectfully and are made to feel comfortable as they gather the food their family needs. At Thanksgiving time those families receive a turkey provided by the Boston Food Bank, and the trimmings and gift cards from Our Neighbors' Table.

Never underestimate the value of loose change and small bills that are donated to the COFFEE HOUR PENNY BOWL! Our Team recently purchased 54 dozen diapers, from Penny Bowl donations, that were taken to the Community Giving Tree for distribution. Accompanying the diaper donations were eight beautiful baby quilts, made by members of the Guild; they will be part of the "baby bundles" that are given to needy families at Christmas.

In Fellowship Hall you will see a Christmas Tree, that is an idea from our Church School children, for gently-used or new HATS and GLOVES/MITTENS that are being collected for the Grace Center of Lifebridge, a Salem, MA, initiative to help Northshore homeless people with winter clothing. Please check your closets for these items you may no longer need; bring them to church and hang them up on the Hats & Gloves Tree.

CHRISTMAS MISSION

The H.O.M.E. mission CHRISTMAS PROJECT is underway! The Narthex Christmas Tree, up by Sunday December 1st, and adorned with angel tags is reaching out to the Angels of our Church, asking you to take a tag or two and fulfill a wish or two for children in Orland, Maine, designated as one of the poorest area of our nation. Our gifts are given to the parents of these children to be opened Christmas morning.

Please choose your tag/tags and plan to return your gifts to the tree by SUNDAY, the 15th. There is one child's wish per tag. Wrap your gift/gifts in holiday paper and tape the tag securely to the package. If you choose to purchase a gift card, please put it in a box and wrap it, or put it in a card, then in a gift bag, and tape it closed so it won't get lost! It is important that each gift be returned with the tag. Take note of the highlighted, coded numbers on the tag/tags that you take from the tree. You will see a chart next to the tree. Sign your name next to the corresponding numbers on this chart. Thank you for taking a few minutes of your time to signup. Keeping track of these gifts is a huge help to the Outreach Team!

Greetings From The Diaconate

Luke 2:9-14: "And, lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them: and they were sore afraid. And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord. And this shall be a sign unto you; Ye shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger. And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God, and saying, Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men."

I have fond and loving memories of the Christmas story from Luke. It was the first Bible passage that I learned as a child and one that my mother worked with me and my sisters to memorize. I imagined a peaceful quiet field, sheep huddled together, dusk settling in, a sliver of moon, stars starting to twinkle as the sky darkens, and the story of four shepherds. One shepherd is sitting on a blanket, trying to stay awake, passing the time with a lamp, playing a game like ancient solitaire. Two other shepherds are talking with each other about the weather, family, and the latest country news. One shepherd is walking around the sheep, petting them, pulling hay out of their wool, and then scooping up a little lamb for warmth, warmth for both the lamb and the shepherd. Then suddenly, loud music breaks open from the sky, like a rock concert full of energy, flashing lights, and emotion! One shepherd drops to the ground on his belly, two cower together, and the other drops to his knees while cradling the lamb, all of them full of shock and fear! But the angel chorus tells them NOT to be afraid that they have good news! As their minds try to make reason out of what they see, they slowly get up, talking to each other, and then begin asking the angels questions while learning more about the newborn savior.

During Advent, we continue to proclaim this good news, that Jesus is born, bringing hope, peace, joy, and love! While our church joins the angel chorus, we cherish the moments of remembering God's gift through the lighting of candles, beautiful music by the bell choir, organ, church choir, and trumpet, shared by the talent and love of our church.

This year, your Diaconate - Rachel, Marie, Pam, Kristen, and Alecia, we were full of hope. Hope in planning worship services; the hope of finding an Interim Pastor; Peace that God directed our process of interviewing candidates; joy in calling Rev. Dallas Bradel to serve with us; and love for our congregation. It is through this love that we wish you many special moments. It could be the warm aroma of freshly baked sugar cookies, the smell of a pine bough laden ornament, cherishing memories of loved ones, and making new memories with friends and family.

We appreciate Rev. Dallas's first Sunday ministering to us as we reflect on "Are we there yet?" We reflect upon and appreciate the process of being together on our journey of faith. We are thankful that on her first Sunday with us, we welcomed a new Pastor with delicious cake, worshiping through the hanging of the greens, worshiping in song, filling the fellowship hall with laughter, and warm hugs of friendship.

As always, we are thankful for our office manager Jessica, the support that she brings in our times of transition, in creating bulletins, newsletters, and being there for us.

In December, we will grace the sanctuary with beautiful Memorial Poinsettias. The Diaconate will be collecting the donation forms up until December 17. Please read all of the information in this December newsletter; we are brimming with events this month. Take in your favorite ones, maybe try some new ones! May God bring to you, your friends, and family the Christmas message of hope, peace, joy, and love and the promise of blessings in the New Year.
