Thirty five years ago this May, a young nervous bride, adorned in a

borrowed wedding dress that her mother had designed and sewn many years before for her own wedding, held a bouquet of white roses. The day was perfect, unusual for May, a clear blue sky and gentle warmth filled the air. That bride was me, standing in the entry of the Chapel before walking down the aisle at the Yale Divinity School Chapel in New Haven, CT.

As poor graduate students, Steve and I prepared our own reception at the Divinity School common room. My friends made the tea sandwiches and punch, my Mom brought the

wedding cake all the way from Henry's, and Steve's parents arranged for the flowers. It was a busy, happy day.

As everything was winding down, I handed a rose from my bouquet to each friend, thanking them for their part in the day. One of my friends took hers, cut off the stem and told me "I am going to hide this, so you will find this one day". Later, after the honeymoon to Nantucket and the move, I looked around but never found the hidden rose.

Twenty years later, I opened a thick, big study Bible to prepare for a service. And there, under 1 Corinthians 13 "Love is patient, love is kind..." was the perfectly flat dried rose from my bouquet. Having been

married for all that time, I had learned that it wasn't the grand romantic gesture that makes the marriage, although those are nice. No, it was the many kindnesses and moments of patience, and all the things Paul wrote so beautifully about in 1 Corinthians 13, that make marriage blossom, or any friendship blossom. I sat for awhile reflecting and then gently placed the rose back in the huge book, in the same location, for safe keeping. Maybe in five more years I will bring it out again.

I want to thank Steve for making this journey with me, and to celebrate his place in my life. Happy 35th anniversary, Steve!


