I know we will welcome everyone who joins us at the fair, and my prayer is that persons who might need to know that welcome more deeply, might sense that welcome and join us for church someday. I know we will welcome them if they give us a try, and I hope we might continue to talk about even more ways of reaching out to people and making our church an even safer community for all who need to know that God loves them and so do we. I have total faith in us.

We are excited to announce that the generous gifts, given to the Merrimack Valley Disaster Fund Offering, amounted to \$930; and we're still counting! We are grateful for the support you have given to families in our neighboring towns as they deal with the serious physical, financial, and emotional problems created by last month's explosions. Thanks to everyone. We'll keep you posted.

We are grateful to our Church Family for the continuing support of our Coffee Hour Penny Bowl. Recently we counted up the coins and bills and were able to purchase ninety-one dozen diapers to help small children through the ministry of the Community Giving Tree! Our pocket change and dollar bills are put to good use right here in the Merrimack Valley.

OUR NEIGHBORS' TABLE ministry in Amesbury is sponsoring a local Thanksgiving project, and it's not too difficult or too expensive. Next month they will be the recipient of fresh vegetables from neighboring farms and turkeys from the Boston Food Bank. They are asking folks to add the extra Thanksgiving trimmings. If you are interested, please pick up a bag from the Narthex on *Sunday, November 4th.* Stapled to the bag will be a short list of desired items. We ask that the bags be returned the following *Sunday, November 11* so that distributions by Our Neighbors' Table may begin on November 13 through the 17th, and will provide Thanksgiving dinners to those who are struggling in twelve neighboring towns, including Georgetown. The six-item list includes: stuffing mix, instant potatoes, cranberry sauce, turkey gravy, one or two dessert mixes (such as cookies, cake, brownies) and a \$10 gift certificate to Market Basket.
