#### **Outreach News**

As summer winds down, we want to report on our summer mission projects, beginning with the Blessing of the Animals on June 30th. During this outdoor service, when our pets were welcomed and blessed, our congregation donated material goods and cash gifts to help our neighboring MSPCA NEVINS FARM in Methuen, an organization that rescues and provides medical aid for animals numbering in the thousands, including small pets as well as farm animals. It was a joyous service, highlighting our love and dependence on our companion animals.

For three weeks in August our Church Family collected varied school supplies and back packs that found their way to RUTH'S HOUSE in Haverhill on the last week. Ten full to over-flowing shopping bags were delivered to the dedicated staff at Ruth's House. They expressed thankfulness for our gifts and assured us that these donations will be received with appreciation by parents needing to help their children with school essentials.

As we move toward the new year, the Outreach Team will focus on local charities. For several months last winter and spring we put all of our resources in one basket, saving our donations for a clean water initiative. This endeavor led us to a faraway village in Western Kenya where the inhabitants will benefit from a protected spring that is being built with the funds we raised. Now it is time to turn back to the needs of our local communities.

On OCTOBER 6, in conjunction with WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY, and in appreciation of a small, but vibrant mission in Ipswich, we are asking the congregation to make a special donation toward the work of the HOUSE of PEACE. This mission provides a physical and spiritual shelter to victims of war within a quiet, healing community, and in companionship with adults who have special needs. Over the years, a constant stream of families and children have received shelter, protection, and the warmth of love at this home in neighboring Ipswich. There have been desperate parents with war-disoriented children who have stayed at the House of Peace while receiving medical treatments at the Shriners' Hospital for Children in Boston. For the past thirty years the House of Peace has provided education for peace and moral awakening by their very example.

Finally, the **COFFEE HOUR PENNY BOWL**, will again be serving the **COMMUNITY GIVING TREE** in Boxford, by providing baby supplies for families in the Merrimack Valley. These supplies are distributed through social workers who partner with the Community Giving Tree. Our loose change and dollars add up quickly and enables the Outreach Team to purchase dozens of needed diapers!

Your Outreach Team realizes the many financial pressures that families and individuals face each day. We continue to be amazed, and continue to be thankful for the sacrifices our congregation makes in supporting our mission initiatives. It is an attitude of gratitude that guides us, and urges us to help our neighbors.

Feeling lucky? Why not take a chance on a raffle. We will once again have many items, gifts, and gift certificates. By a chance and you may take home something special.




