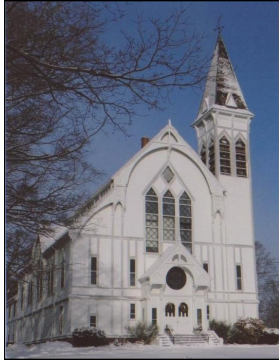

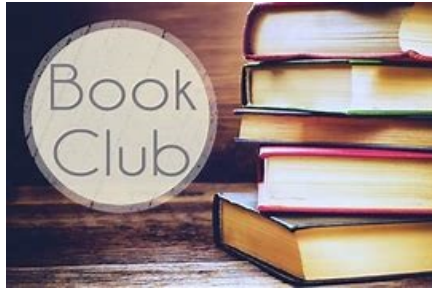

Dear Ones,

Happy April to you! April always fills me with the warmth of renewal. It is a time for new plants to poke up, a time for the birds to sing loudly into the early morning sky, a time to take that early morning coffee out into the yard to see what came up the night before while I was sleeping. And it is a time for the bunnies to come looking for the fresh green nourishment. With some consternation, I have found that Stew, the rabbit, is back in my yard and I've *already* given up on some of the crocuses.

Thankfully, I have this new neighborhood to explore around the church this spring. I have taken advantage of my afternoon walks to get to know the roads of Georgetown a bit. I so enjoy watching other people's crocuses (successfully) bloom amidst the leftover winter leaves in yards along my walking route. The daffodils likewise provide reassurance of yet warmer days still. The tulips and other bulbs aren't far behind - that is if the squirrels and bunnies don't get them as they poke out of the ground. Alas, we are called to share the beauty of this earth, things we planted as well as gracious gifts that God provides without any human effort. We are stewards of this beauty, and we share it with our fellow creatures who reside nearby- even the foxes and deer and who ever else calls the North Shore home.

Since time immemorial, we have been called to steward all nature in our midst. Our Scriptures are full of instruction and reminders of this important role. *"The earth is the Lord's and the fullness there of, the world and all who dwell in it."* (Psalm 24:1) And, *"I brought you into a plentiful land to enjoy its fruits and its good things . . ."* (Jeremiah 2:7a)

And, it all started with Genesis - when we were created and then made stewards of all of God's creation:

"Then God said, 'Let us make (human) in our image, after our likeness. And let them have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over the livestock and over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth.'"

Note this word, "dominion," which means that we would be overseeing the care of **all** - not to destroy or "dominate" but to steward; to take good care of it all. Oh, how we humans have misused this notion of "dominion."

Let us remember this spring, as we lean into April and warmer days, that we are stewards of all we see, plants, animals, creatures of every kind that meet along the way. Let us lend to the earth's continued healing, each doing our part to be mindful of what and how we plant and even if it means putting up with Stew, the rabbit who will so enjoy much of the "bounty" that we plant.

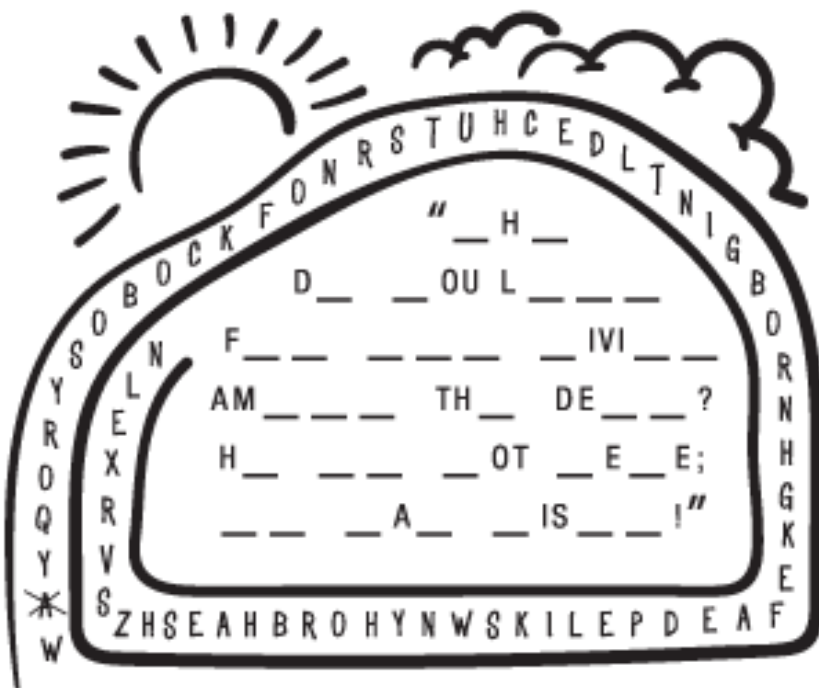

SUNRISE SURPRISE

The hidden surprise in these sweet rolls hints at the reason behind Easter's joy.

What you need:

- ½ cup chopped pecans
- 10 uncooked frozen rolls, thawed
- 10 large marshmallows
- ½ cup sugar
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- ½ cup melted butter
- ¼ cup brown sugar
- Adult help

What you do:

1. Grease a round baking dish. Sprinkle pecans on the bottom.
2. Flatten each roll. Place a marshmallow in the center, wrap dough around it and pinch edges together.
3. Combine sugar and cinnamon. Dip each roll into melted butter and coat with cinnamon-sugar. Place in pan, seam side down.
4. Sprinkle brown sugar and remaining butter over rolls. Cover with plastic wrap and let rise 30 minutes.
5. Bake at 350 degrees until golden brown, about 30 minutes. Cool in pan.
6. As you bite into a roll, you'll see the marshmallow has melted, leaving an empty center — just like Jesus' empty tomb!
