Dear Ones,

On my walks around Georgetown lately I have so enjoyed all the gardens in bloom. The colors that are bursting. Each garden is a new work of art, week after week. It lifts my spirit as I walk along, clearing my head while I wrestle with the scripture of the week in preparation for the next sermon. We need all the colors of the rainbow, and they are so good to see out in nature.

Equally uplifting are the rainbow flags donning front doorways and front lawns on my walks. And as I pass in front of our church, I am so proud to see our own small rainbow on the church sign, announcing our affinity as "Open and Affirming," and welcoming to all. These flags and signs are reminders of all the colors of the rainbow represented in the people in our neighborhoods. Our hearts and souls are each uniquely made, in love, by our Creator God. Each in love, made to love, as God ordains. Just as God ordains the sun to rise and the rain to feed our gardens.

In January 2015, this faith community voted to become an Open and Affirming (ONA) Congregation of the United Church of Christ. I am so excited that you made this bold commitment and covenant of extravagant welcome to all God's children. Following Jesus's example of radical hospitality, I look forward to walking more deeply into this covenant with you; to learn together how we can best support and celebrate the children, youth and adults living in our neighborhoods who identify as LGBTQ, or some mixture of all these things.

Jesus summarized the great commandments into two, to love God and our neighbors as ourselves (Mark 12:28-34). And Paul teaches acceptance of one another to the early church of Rome (Romans 14:1-15:13). These are good solid foundations to affirm the welcome of all persons regardless of race, age, gender identity and expression, marital status, physical or mental ability, economic status, nationality, sexual orientation or identity. And this is what you affirmed in your ONA covenant.

June is Gay Pride month in this country - a month when we are invited to remember our LGBTQ (Lesbian, Gay, Bi-sexual, Transgender, Queer) siblings. This month we remember those involved in the Stonewall Riots and June 28th marks the date in history when the first Pride march was held in New York City in 1970. In the 52 years since then, laws and statutes have eased some of life for the LGBTQ community. Yet many of our neighbors remain silent, unseen or

shamed into obscurity and darkness. Many LGBTQ youth still hesitate to name their truth and live out loud and many parents struggle to navigate this journey authentically and completely with their children. Many adults find it difficult to openly live in the light and into their most authentic selves as they perceive or experience critical judgment from society. The church is called to be the light shining in the darkness, overcoming fear and separation.

During this month of June, we as a congregation will be paying a bit more attention to how we might be more openly supportive of the LGBTQ community around us, prayerfully discerning how to move more deeply into living this love of God out loud.

If this is something close to your heart, please reach out to me. Let's talk. We are a community of uniquely made and universally loved children of God. And we are in this together.
