To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith... to another gifts of healing... to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits.... All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses."

1 Corinthians 12:1-11 adapted

Dear Ones of FCC Georgetown,

Grace and peace to you this summer season of renewal. In his letters to the early church in Corinth, Paul spends a good deal of time on the Spirit of God and the invitation to seek within each member their own gifts that come from the Spirit. Paul is exhorting this bunch of early converts to stay together, to keep focused on the building of their community. And he names for them the gifts of the Spirit, that they each might possess *already* in some form to be used in the mission of the early church -- used to build up the body of Christ, or what will much later be called the church.

As usual, there is much that we can learn from Paul's letters. These words of encouragement are relevant for us today as the First Congregational Church of Georgetown considers how best to move forward, and what new thing God has in store for us. And we would do well to remember *daily* that Jesus did not come to live among us to build structures and keep all who gather safe within. Jesus Christ dwelt among us to show us the coming of

God's kingdom all around us and that is our ultimate focus. Another word for "kingdom" is "commonwealth." We worship together to celebrate God's love and gain strength from God and from each other to go out into the world (Georgetown and beyond) to share this message of love, alleviate suffering, feed those who hunger, sit with those who are lonely, for the common "wealth" or wellbeing of all.

I have recently begun to invite you as a faith community to explore this concept of "spiritual gifts" during Wednesday evening worship. I invited the congregation to begin to wonder about your own gifts that come from God - gifts of the Spirit. If we can each name our gifts that originated from our Creator God, we can then best discern together how God might be using us today to build up God's commonwealth here on earth. This includes the present church body and the greater community.

This exploration is a long-term endeavor; an on-going process of discovery. This is not a one-time exercise where our abilities are defined or judged as good or bad, as helpful or as life-limiting. I invite you to open your heart and mind to what you are gifted with, thanks to your Creator.

It might help to think of things you do, activities that you are part of that bring you great joy. It might be that you have honed a skill over time, and in this effort you have been fulfilled. Consider these skills and aptitudes as gifts of the Spirit of God. When you think of the words "spiritual gifts," what comes to mind? Talents? Skills? Aptitude towards numbers or some form of art such as painting or music? Perhaps teaching or telling stories?

Some gifts we explored recently in worship included, *compassion*, *hospitality*, *helping*, *administration*, *music*, *wisdom*, *writing*. There are so many gifts, and we when recognize that they have an Ultimate Source (God) we are encouraged to put them to use in the best possible way - to build the kingdom of God here in our own time and place.

Let's keep talking and exploring this notion of spiritual gifts, and may you find joy in naming and using your gifts to further the Kingdom of Heaven here on earth.
