Let this be our moto for this New Year, from 1 Corinthians 12

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

As the Apostle Paul wrote to the church of Corinth, "our gifts are activated by one and the same Spirit . . . to each individually just as the Spirit chooses."

Christmas and this holiday season of gift giving might be over till next December - that time to give or receive that special something individual enjoyment. And for us, as a faith community, we know that the extravagance of love and giving continues all year long. As Paul reminds the people, the call to faith is to use our spiritual gifts for the common good.

I have witnessed this in you, dear congregation. This concern for the common good. And as I turn my mind to this new year, my heart is full of gratitude for you: for this faith community; for your curiosity; for your energy for service and outreach; for your love that you show each other.

I pray for each of you as we turn together to what's next. Considering the adventures of 2021, with COVID restrictions, our careful get togethers, and celebrations - what a year it was, full of twists and turns, with new challenges and chances to learn new things.

On the 23rd of this month, I will have been with you officially for one year. I am so thankful for you! 
