
May Newsletter

Chris highlighted the era by explaining the cultural changes that were emerging in society after World War I. Her visual presentation was a thoughtful mixture of serious and fun and showed us how the world was turning in 1923 here in Georgetown and in the wider community. George Comiskey created a wonderful background musical presentation to play while our guests enjoyed tea and mini desserts, provided by members of the Guild and a few other generous women of our congregation.
