I love to cook, and for a long time I had lots of cookbooks, so many in fact that I ran out of room. I mostly use cookbooks for inspiration, sometimes following the directions, sometimes experimenting, going rogue with ingredients if I don't have exactly what the recipe calls for. And if all goes well, I make a note about what I did and how it turned out – little notes on the margins in the cookbook.

Often, I have found the recipes worked. Largely, I suppose this is so because they had been vetted by some publisher to be valid and decent. Not all have been to my taste, too bland sometimes, or too fishy other times, but in general the recipes followed decent protocols for boiling things long enough, or roasting so the meat is safe to eat. Someone with authority in cooking made sure the recipe was valid before going through the trouble of putting it into their cookbook to be published.

Then, with the onset of fast internet access, I have discovered the beauty of the World Wide Web and finding recipes online. My brain exploded with delight at the culinary creativity of what could be done with such a variety of ingredients! My imagination went wild! And I began to rely more and more on this resource for gastronomical inspiration. What fun it has been to plug in the seemingly unrelated ingredients and find that indeed several people have found a way to make them into a meal! And this was all wonderful until it wasn't.

More and more I have found that so many recipes have not been vetted by experts before going viral on social media. The quick and slick video production masked the lousy flavor that results from their experimentation.
