

Dear Church.

Think of these things and then please send me a note. Your thoughts of course will stay anonymous even as I respond to them to help us all dive deeper into our life-long faith journey. So, let's explore things together. Let's see what bubbles up from your curiosities and questions.

PENNY BOWL BENEFITS MERRIMACK VALLEY'S NEEDY CHILDREN

Your continued support of the Coffee Hour Penny Bowl, sponsored by the Women's Guild, has benefited the Community Giving Tree of West Boxford for the past three months (April – June).

Your gifts of loose change and paper money purchased thirty dozen diapers, plus numerous packages of baby wipes that will be distributed by social agencies throughout our area.

Last year the Giving Tree helped fifteen thousand families with basic children's needs, including clothing in good condition for young children, and older kids, diapers, related baby necessities, baby furniture, and school supplies.

This mission, started in a garage by a member of the Second Congregational Church of Boxford twenty years ago, has expanded and is now housed in two buildings - one in Boxford and one in Lawrence.

They have partnered with many social agencies of the Merrimack Valley to provide urgent care to underserved children. Through the years, our Church Family is proud to help this very worthy and local organization!

All applications will be reviewed and approved on a first-come, first-served basis with the right to buy the home going to the first approved applicant. This is not a Habitat Home. Habitat for Humanity is solely acting as the monitoring agent for the sale. This application cycle closes on September 2, 2024.


