

#### **SCRIPTURES**

#### John 10: 11-16

Jesus was speaking to the Pharisees when he said, "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd sacrifices his life for the sheep. A hired hand will run when he sees a wolf coming. He will abandon the sheep because they don't belong to him and he isn't their shepherd. So when the wolf attacks them and scatters the flock, the hired hand runs away because he's working only for the money and doesn't really care about the sheep. But I am the good shepherd. I know my own sheep, and they know me, just as my Father knows me and I know the Father. So I sacrifice my life for the sheep. I have other sheep, too, that are not in this fold. I must bring them also. They will listen to my voice, and there will be one flock, with one shepherd."

#### Matthew 18: 12-14

Jesus said to his disciples, "Suppose a man owns 100 sheep and one of them wanders away. Won't he leave the 99 sheep on the hills so he can go and look for the one that wandered off? What I'm about to tell you is true. If he finds that sheep, he is happier about the one than about the 99 that didn't wander off. It is the same with your Father in heaven. He does not want any of these little ones to be lost.




