
# <u> Medical Equipment</u>

# FCC'S MISSION FOR SEPTEMBER & OCTOBER IS NAMI

FCC's mission for the months of September and October is the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) of Massachusetts, a nonprofit organization that has been working since 1982 to make sure no one faces mental health challenges alone. Throughout the fall, FCC will be raising awareness through a sermon series and making a financial donation to NAMI, an effort that goes hand-in-hand with our dedication to becoming designated by the UCC as a WISE congregation ("Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive, and Engaged" in the mental health of the community and the wider world).

NAMI's national goal is to improve the lives of people living with mental illness and their families by offering education, support, and advocacy. At the heart of their work is a belief in dignity, compassion, and community. More locally, NAMI Mass provides free support groups, educational classes, and resources across the state so that individuals and families can find understanding and hope. They run a helpline where trained staff and volunteers — many of whom have lived through their own mental health journeys — listen, guide, and connect callers to services. They also speak out at the State House and in communities to raise awareness, reduce stigma, and push for policies that make mental health care more just and accessible for everyone.

This work is deeply important because **mental health touches every family**, **including those within our own congregation**. By supporting NAMI Massachusetts this fall, we are standing alongside an organization that offers light, hope, and connection to people in some of their hardest seasons. It is **a way for us to live out our faith in action** — helping ensure that no one struggles in silence, and that all God's children can experience care, community, and healing.
